Guitarist

Guitarist Esther Steenbergen is internationally recognized for her fresh approach to the repertoire. Renowned as a soloist, ensemble player and accompanist of singers and instrumentalists, she works with musicians and artists from numerous styles and disciplines and occasionally takes part in theater productions. With her own trio she happily crosses the classical repertoire with Latin, jazz and folklore. As a member of the highly acclaimed Amsterdam Guitar Trio and accompanist of the well known bass-baritone Maarten Koningsberger, she traveled the world and performed all over Europe, the Americas and Asia.

Initiator

Esther Steenbergen has a broad interest. She initiated four music theatre productions as well as a monthly talk show, for, with and about musicians. Since 1998 she is the organizer of Meesters op de Gitaar, the international guitar series in the Concertgebouw in Amsterdam (the Netherlands).

Education

Esther Steenbergen studied musicology and art policy at the University of Utrecht (The Netherlands) as well as classical guitar with Hubert Käppel at the *Musikhochschule Köln*, (Germany). She took lessons with the Czech guitarist Pavel Steidl and participated in master classes with the Cubans Manuel Barrueco and Leo Brouwer. While still a student, she won the first prize at the *Concurs International de Música Maria Canals de Barcelona*. (Spain).
